

# **HOUSING TRUST FUNDS**

Housing trust funds were first developed in the 1970s and became more common in the 1980s and 1990s. In Massachusetts, it was after the passage of the **Municipal Affordable Housing Trust (MAHT) statute, M.G.L Chapter 44, Section 55c**, in 2005 that cities and towns began to more actively create housing trust funds. Today over 100 communities in the state have a local affordable housing trust fund.

The popularity of housing trust funds has coincided with the local passage of the Community Preservation Act (CPA). Almost 80% of communities that have created a housing trust fund have also adopted CPA. Ideally, the housing rust fund and community preservation committee (CPC) work collaboratively, along with other boards and departments, to address local affordable housing needs.

Most housing trust funds in Massachusetts are municipal entities focused on creating and preserving affordable housing, generally described as housing for household earning up to 100% of the area median income (AMI). Commonly referred to as "housing trusts", these entities are similar in structure with some variation in powers granted and trustees appointed to manage the fund.

About a dozen housing trust funds were created through special legislation under home rule petition, before the MAHT statute was passed. A few are not connected to the municipality or focus beyond affordable housing.

## **Board of Trustees**

A housing trust fund organized under M.G.L Chapter 44, Section 55c, must have a minimum of 5 trustees, including the community's chief executive officer. In communities where the chief executive officer is a multimember board (e.g. Select Board) the board shall designate a minimum of one member to serve as a trustee. Terms are set at 2 years and often staggered. Appointments are made by the mayor or manager in a city or town, subject to confirmation by the city council or select board.

Many communities opt to have more than 5 trustees and there is wide variation in who is appointed. Some communities specify in their ordinance or bylaw that trustees should have specific work experience or sit on other local boards. Other communities simply pass the MAHT statute as it is written. Still, others have a mix of wide open seats and more directive guidance for appointments.

## **Housing Trust Funds Powers**

Sixteen powers are given to housing trust funds in the state statute. Occasionally, a community may create a housing trust fund with some restrictions on powers such as requiring a two-thirds vote of the trustees to purchase or sell a real property interest. The statute also allows a community to omit or modify powers, as well as grant additional powers. See a full list of powers **here**.

## Sources of Funding

## #438-20

Communities have created many ways to capitalize their housing trust funds. While CPA remains the most common resource, in 2017 the town of Medfield bonded \$1 million (without CPA) to fund their newly created housing trust fund. Then in 2018, we saw the first tax override of \$275,000 in Orleans to fund their new municipal affordable housing trust fund. Additionally, several communities direct inclusionary zoning "in lieu" of payments to their housing trust funds and some have transferred "free cash" to the trust fund.

The most active and successful housing trust funds tend to have a variety of funding sources that allow them to have a steady flow of financial resources to work with. For housing trust funds that receive CPA resources, an annual report must be submitted to the local Community Preservation Committee (CPC) to outline how the trust allocated CPA funds during the past year. The CPC then reports this data to the Department of Revenue (DOR) in their annual CP-3 report due September 15.



## Testimonial Commendation (draft) Honoring The Fair Housing Committee

Recognizing their important work in fair access to housing and providing equal opportunity for all

Whereas, diverse, inclusive communities with access to good jobs, schools, health care, transportation, and housing are crucial to our region and nation's prosperity in the 21st century and

Whereas, persistent racial segregation in housing is the legacy of explicit federal, state, and local policies that defined where black and white Americans could live prior to the Fair Housing Act<sup>1</sup> and

Whereas, discrimination in housing continues to be a critical issue for many people not only because of the color of their skin, but also if they have children, how they worship, where they were born, if they have a disability, their gender, who they love or their gender identity and expression and

Whereas, housing discrimination has a long-term effect on the wealth, health and education opportunities for these people and their families and

Whereas, In the early 1960s, a committee was organized by a group of Newton citizens to combat housing discrimination based on race. This effort was a response to the taking of homes of African-Americans in West Newton for the Massachusetts Turnpike, who were denied alternative housing in Newton because of racial discrimination and

Whereas, while Congressional efforts to address fair housing had failed in two congressional terms, the dramatic aftermath of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s assassination on April 4, 1968 pushed Legislators into taking healing and swift action and President Lydon B. Johnson signed the Fair Housing Act into law just a week later on April 11<sup>th</sup>, 1968 and

Whereas, the Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination concerning the sale, rental, and financing of housing based on race, religion, national origin, sex, disability, and family status and

Whereas, on January 20<sup>th</sup> of this year President Biden signed an executive order further extending protections by prohibiting discrimination in housing because of gender identity or sexual orientation and

Whereas, in 2005, the Newton Housing Partnership created the Fair Housing Task Force, in order to investigate and address housing discrimination in Newton. The task force found disparate treatment within the city and undertook fair housing education and outreach programs for realtors, housing owners and managers, housing agencies, city staff, and the general public and

Whereas, in 2008, Mayor David Cohen formally established the Newton Fair Housing Committee (NFHC), a citizen advisory board, to promote and support the city's efforts to be a diverse and welcoming community with fair housing choices and opportunities for all, free from discrimination. This agenda has been carried forward actively by NFHC since its inception and

Whereas, in 2015, Newton entered into a settlement to resolve a complaint filed with HUD by the Engine 6 advocacy group, alleging that the city violated fair housing laws by obstructing a proposal to create supportive housing for the chronically homeless and

Whereas, Newton, given it is a community that receives funds from HUD, is required to create a five-year action plan to Affirmatively Further Fair Housing - the WestMetro HOME Consortium Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice 2021-2025<sup>3</sup> lists several key strategies and actions and

Whereas, the Newton Fair Housing Committee is already undertaking some of the recommended actions including:

- education programs on Fair Housing for realtors, housing owners and managers, housing agencies, city staff, and the general public and
- review of major residential development proposals to determine whether they meet or exceed regulatory fair housing requirements, and shares its findings with the relevant permit granting authority and
- evaluation of the use of local preference option in affordable housing lotteries to determine its impact on Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing and

Whereas, the Fair Housing Committee's expertise and focus will important in addressing other action items from the AI including the review of restrictive zoning policies that limit the amount of multi-family and affordable housing as well as compliance with recently passed state legislation that requires the creation of at least one by-right multi-family zone close to transit and

Whereas, and in summary we embrace the definition of Fair Housing put forward in the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice: Fair housing exists when people can find safe, suitable housing within their economic means wherever they choose to live, and they do not face discrimination based on their membership in a protected class.

Initially, I served as a full member when the Commission was created but then stepped down to become an alternate member roughly thirteen years ago with the hope that others might come forward to volunteer their time. With respect to my qualifications, I have lived at 26 Old Orchard Road since 1950, well before the Historic District Commission became into being and while such estates as the Webster or Houghton were still "intact". As such, I bring to the Commission the perspective of a long "institutional memory" of how the area appeared and what is "historic" and what is of more recent vintage.

Until 1986 I ran, following my father's death, a family painting company. In its day, it was arguably the "go to" firm for assistance with historical paint colors and the application there of. Specifically, the company was actively involved with the restoration of Historic Williamsburg, Old Sturbridge Village, and Strawberry Banke.
